You could be part of the essential work that helps to drive the economy forward, constructing a huge range of buildings and infrastructure including, houses, hospitals, roads, motorways and large investment projects.

The construction industry offers a wide variety of exciting career opportunities and continues to need high quality new recruits to minimise the threat of skills shortages.

There are dozens of construction apprenticeship available covering a wide variety of trades and occupations.

Many Construction Managers and other construction professionals started their careers as apprentices so there is opportunity for career progression.



Benefits of being a construction apprentice

There are many benefits for you and your employer when you take part in an apprenticeship:

- You earn while you learn
- You work alongside experienced crafts people gaining hands on training
- You receive off-the-job training specific to your apprenticeship that can lead on to other qualifications and opportunities.
- You gain qualifications
- You get a chance to use skills
- You develop a career with a future
- Your confidence and abilities increase
- Potential to become self-employed in the future
- Use your skills to work around the world
- If your employer is a CITB NI Registered Employer they can receive up to £4,000 grant funding for the duration of your apprenticeship and are eligible for more Government funding to the value of £1,500

How much will I get paid? This will be agreed with your employer, but the current national minimum wage is £3.70 per hour and the current recommended rate agreed by the Joint Council for the Building & Civil Engineering Industry (NI) is over £200 per week (£5.65 per

hour) rising to over £400 per week (£10.67 per hour)
