Conor will be hoping to follow in the footsteps of former Northern Regional College apprentice, Samuel Gilmore, from Aghadowey. Samuel was a gold medal winner at WorldSkills UK national finals in 2018 and the following year he was an award winner at the European Alliance for Apprenticeship Awards in

The SkillBuild competition, which is governed by CITB, is the largest multi-trade competition in the UK for young students and apprentices. The annual apprentices. competition is designed to test skills, techniques and ability to work within tight timeframes in the construction trades which also include brickwork, plumbing, electrical, floor tiling, plastering and brickwork.

Ian Forsythe, Curriculum Area Manager for Construction in the of Department Advanced Technologies at Northern Regional College, said: "The SkillBuild competitions are a great opportunity for our students to demonstrate their skills and knowledge gained in their specific curriculum skill area.
