2024 Stakeholder Satisfaction Survey



CITB NI's mission is to develop and embed a training culture which improves the skills and productivity of the Northern Ireland construction industry.

The stakeholder survey helps determine how well CITB NI is achieving its aims and objectives in the opinion of various stakeholders. A total of 118 stakeholders were contacted to participate in the survey, 64 responded, giving a 54% response rate.

All respondents had heard of CITB NI before receiving the survey and all had varying levels of contact with CITB NI over the last 24 months.


Findings

- of stakeholders who responded to the survey had contacted CITB NI for information, help or advice on construction industry skills or training related issues in the last 24 months.
- of respondents believe CITB NI are better than all other organisations they are aware off for the skills solutions they offer, for sector specific help and advice on Construction skills or training.
