NRC apprentices strike gold at the Skills Show!

CONGRATULATIONS to two Ballymena apprentices Robert Hamilton and Ryan Connor who won gold at the Skills Show in Birmingham last week.

Robert, the youngest competitor in the Carpentry & Joinery Skill Area, is a past student of Dunclogh College and was introduced to the College through the Entitlement Framework route at the age of 14 studying Construction units from the CCEA Occupational Studies qualification.

This course was part of a Ballymena Learning Together partnership funded under the Entitlement Framework Programme.

He then progressed to NRC to take up his apprenticeship full-time.

Ryan Connor and NRC/ETT apprentice who was the gold medal winner in Electrical Installation at the Skillbuild competition earlier this year has also scooped the top award in this category in Birmingham.

Ryan is employed by Knox Electrical Ltd. Electrical Installation Tutor,

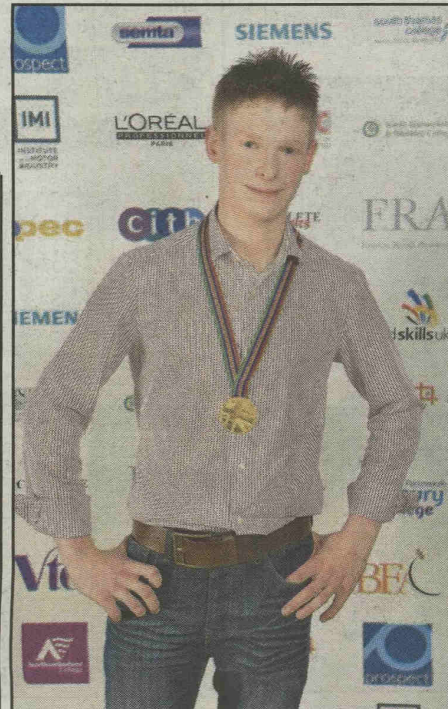
